This letter is addressed to all concerned with the future of Maison du Peuple, Clichy

I write as International Secretary on behalf of DoCoMoMo-UK, the British chapter of the international organization formally constituted at The Eindhoven Conference in The Netherlands in 1990 to protect and preserve significant buildings and sites of the Modern Movement, and now represented in over seventy countries worldwide.

It has come to our attention that the future of Maison du Peuple, Clichy may be jeopardized by immediately adjacent development and that this highly significant architectural work of the architects Jean Prouve, Eugene Beaudouin and Marcel Lods could be grossly disfigured.

We wish to register our opposition to any such proposals in the strongest possible terms, and to call on those intent on such redevelopment, or responsible for granting its consent, to pause, re-consider and formulate alternative strategies to ensure that this beacon of progressive architectural thought is not compromised by unsuitable urban intervention.

The exceptional cultural importance of Maison du Peuple has been recognised in registering its status as a historic monument in 1983 and this in itself should oblige all those engaged with future work or development of the building and its environs to proceed with the utmost caution and consideration in order to avoid detriment to the building or its setting. The proposed juxtaposition of a 96 metre high tower cannot but cause irretrievable harm to the monument's significance and urban *mise en scène*.

Unfortunately the vastly ambitious programme of *Inventons la Métropole* is here being exploited as pretext for a grossly excessive form of development carrying all the familiar clichés of architectural self-justification – “bold intervention, visionary concept, transformational gesture”, etc, etc – which prove to be so much vacuous hyperbole when the tawdry reality is eventually revealed. One need only look at what has been perpetrated on the City of London skyline over the last 10 – 15 years to see the consequences of this rapacious style of urban planning. Enough is surely now known in this regard to show that while tall buildings may have their place in certain locations, they do not make good neighbours in historically sensitive settings such as this. The Maison du Peuple and the community of Clichy deserve better.

Nous attirons votre attention sur l'opportunité d'apporter ces transformations importantes et irréversibles, qui compromettent l'intégrité matérielle de l'œuvre et en perturbent fortement la lecture architecturale.

La Maison du Peuple est un monument historique et mérite d'être valorisée comme tel. C'est donc avec conviction que nous apportons notre soutien à la mobilisation internationale en faveur de sa sauvegarde.
